YOUR INFORMATION. YOUR RIGHTS. OUR RESPONSIBILITIES.

This notice applies to the privacy practices of Counseling Services of Greater Boston, LLC ("CSGB"). CSGB provides mental health services through in-person and telehealth modalities. This notice applies regardless of how services are delivered. CSGB is required by law to maintain the privacy of your protected health information ("PHI"). This notice describes how health care information about you may be used and disclosed; and how you can get access to this information. Please review it carefully.

YOUR RIGHTS

You have rights to access records, request amendments, request restrictions, and file complaints without retaliation. This section explains your rights and some of our responsibilities to help you.

Get an electronic or paper copy of your medical record

- You can ask to see or get an electronic or paper copy of your medical record and other health information we have about you. Ask us how to do this.
- We will provide a copy or a summary of your health information, usually within 15 days of your request. We may charge a reasonable, cost-based fee.

Ask us to correct your medical record

- You can ask us to correct health information about you that you think is incorrect or incomplete. We may say "no" to your request, but we'll tell you why in writing within 60 days.

Request confidential communications

- You can ask us to contact you in a specific way (for example, home or office phone) or to send mail to a different address. We will say "yes" to all reasonable requests.

Ask us to limit what we use or share

- You can ask us not to use or share certain health information for treatment, payment, or our operations. We are not required to agree to your request if it would affect your care.
- If you pay for a service or health care item out-of-pocket in full, you can ask us not to share that information for the purpose of payment or our operations with your health insurer. We will comply unless a law requires us to share that information.

Get a list of those with whom we've shared info

- You can ask for a list (accounting) of the times we've shared your health information for six years prior to the date you ask, who we shared it with, and why. We will include all the disclosures except for those about treatment, payment, and health care operations, and certain other disclosures (such as any you asked us to make).

Get a copy of this privacy notice

- You can ask for a paper copy of this notice at any time, even if you have agreed to receive the notice electronically. We will provide you with a paper copy promptly.

Choose someone to act for you

- If you have given someone medical power of attorney or if someone is your legal guardian, that person can exercise your rights and make choices about your health information.

File a complaint if you feel your rights are violated

- If you believe that CSGB may have violated your privacy rights you may complain to us using the contact information listed below.
- You can file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Office for Civil Rights by sending a letter to 200 Independence Avenue, S.W., Washington, D.C. 20201, calling 1-877-696-6775, or visiting www.hhs.gov/ocr/privacy/hipaa/complaints/.
- We will not retaliate against you for filing a complaint.

YOUR CHOICES

For certain health information, you can tell us your choices about what and how we share your information.

- Share information with your family, close friends, or others involved in your care.
We may disclose your relevant PHI to family members, friends or others that you identify as being involved with your health care or with payment for your health care. Before doing so, we will provide you with an opportunity to object to such uses or disclosures.
- Share information in a disaster relief situation
- Include your information in a hospital directory
If you are not able to tell us your preference, for example if you are unconscious, we may go ahead and share your information if we believe it is in your best interest. We may also share your information when needed to lessen a serious and imminent threat to health or safety.

In these cases we never share your information unless you give us written permission:

- Marketing purposes
- Sale of your information
- Most sharing of psychotherapy notes

OUR USES AND DISCLOSURES

How do we use or share your health information? We typically use or share your health information in these ways.

Workforce & Supervision

- We can use your health information and share it with other providers at CSGB. Our workforce includes licensed clinicians, pre-licensed clinicians, supervisors, and administrative staff.
- Supervisors may review records for treatment, supervision, and quality assurance.
- We can use and share your health information to run our practice, improve your care, and contact you when necessary. *We may use and disclose your PHI in connection with our health care operations, including such activities as quality assessment and improvement activities, reviewing the competence or qualifications of*

health care professionals, evaluating practitioner and provider performance, conducting training programs, accreditation, certification, licensing or credentialing activities, activities relating to the creation, renewal or replacement of a contract of health insurance or health benefits. We will not further disclose this PHI for any other purpose, except as required by law.

Billing

- We can use and share your health information to bill and get payment from health plans or other entities. *Example: We give information about you to your health insurance plan so it will pay for your services.*

How else can we use or share your health information?

We are allowed or required to share your information in other ways – usually in ways that contribute to the public good, such as public health and research. We have to meet many conditions in the law before we can share your information for these purposes. For more information see: www.hhs.gov/ocr/privacy/hipaa/understanding/consumers/index.html.

Help with public health and safety issues

We can share health information for certain situations:

- Reporting suspected abuse, neglect, or domestic violence
- Preventing or reducing a serious threat to anyone's health or safety

Address workers' comp, law enforcement, and other government requests

We can use or share health information about you:

- For workers' compensation claims
- For law enforcement purposes
- With health oversight agencies

Do research

- We can use/share your information for health research.

Respond to lawsuits and legal actions

- We can share health information about you in response to a court or administrative order, or in response to a subpoena.

Comply with the law

- We will share information if state or federal laws require it, including with the Dept of Health and Human Services to check if we are in compliance of privacy law.

OUR RESPONSIBILITIES

- We are required by law to maintain the privacy and security of your protected health information.
- We will let you know if a breach occurs that may have compromised the privacy or security of your information.
- We must follow the duties and privacy practices described in this notice and give you a copy of it.
- We will not use or share your information other than as described here unless you tell us we can in writing.
